WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Applicants must be over 18.

Working on a dinosaur dig involves patience, a good eye, a steady hand and the ability to share close quarters with people of all ages. No previous experience in palaeontology is required.

Winton: Where it is and how to get there!

Winton is in the heart of the western Queensland outback

- 173 kms north of Longreach
- 470 kms southeast of Mt Isa
- 598 kms southwest of Townsville
- 1500 kms north west of Brisbane



Travel options for getting to Winton:

FLY: Qantas have daily flights from Brisbane to Longreach. REX Airlines have flights on Tuesdays & Thursdays from Townsville to Winton and Longreach.

DON'T get STRANDED in LONGREACH

To get from Longreach to Winton you need to

- Hire a car from Budget or Avis;
- Fly in a day earlier and then catch the Greyhound bus next day to Winton.
- Book onto the Spirit of the Outback transit bus. (This service can be cancelled at any time)

COACH: Bus Queensland have a daily service through Longreach and Winton to Mt Isa

DRIVE: Bring your own car and take in all of the sights of the Outback along the way.

TRAIN: Train your way from Brisbane to Winton on the Spirit of the Outback. (This service can be cancelled at any time due to line problems or weather) This service leaves Brisbane on Tuesdays and Saturdays to arrive in Longreach/Winton on Wednesdays and Sundays

Accommodation

You need to book accommodation for the Sunday nights before and after your dig dates if staying in Winton. Your dig week accommodation (Monday to Saturday inclusive) is supplied.
